Looking Back, Moving Forward: Purpose in Action

As we begin 2026, I want to take a moment to reflect on what we accomplished together in 2025—and what it reveals about the cooperative we're becoming.

This past year, commitments moved from words on a page to actions that strengthened the entire community. More than 600 members enrolled in the Round Up program, transforming spare change into **over \$28,000 in assistance for 120+ families** facing hardship.

Members, employees, and community partners donated over \$50,000 in bill payment assistance funding for members through the Cooperative Giving program. When 160 families gathered at the Tarrant Area Food Bank West's Community Market, TCEC team members were there, connecting neighbors to resources that extend far beyond the electric meter.

Meanwhile, the TCEC food drive brought essential supplies to Parker County Center of Hope, Azle Community Caring Center, and Weatherford Parker County Animal Shelter, while 34 pints of blood donated through a Carter BloodCare partnership helped more than 100 patients in need.

We also redesigned tcectexas.com using existing resources **at no additional cost to members**, creating powerful search tools and mobile-first design that puts information at your fingertips whenever you need it.

In 2026, we're investing \$200,000 in scholarships for 40 local high school seniors, **funded by unclaimed capital credits** that directly reinvest in the communities we serve.

In the coming months, you'll receive a comprehensive 2025 Annual Report. It's a detailed look at TCEC's financial progress, operational improvements, and community impact. It will show how every decision worked toward TCEC's mission: providing safe and reliable power at the lowest possible cost.



TCEC will hold a special election in Spring 2026 to fill vacant Director seats for Districts 6 and 8. Only members residing within these specific districts are eligible to run for office or cast a vote.


Want to Represent Your District?

The application window opens **January 5, 2026**. Prospective candidates must submit all required materials, including a petition with 25 verifiable signatures from their district, by 5 p.m. on **January 23, 2026**.

Key candidate requirements include: a completed application and affidavit, pass a background check and disclose potential conflicts of interest and complete a mandatory interview with the Credentials and Elections Committee.

- Receive a free health screening, including blood pressure, temperature, iron count, and cholesterol check



TCEC Brings Resources to 160 Families

When the TCEC community engagement team joined a Community Market shopping day at the [Tarrant Area Food Bank West](#), it was about more than just being present. It was about being a resource when families needed it most.

As approximately 160 local families selected nutritious foods through TAFB's dignified client-choice model, TCEC team members were there to share something equally vital: information about programs designed to help members beyond the electric meter.

Families discovered resources like the Brazos Hardship Fund, bill-payment assistance options, and services through Texas Neighborhood Services, all made possible by TCEC Cooperative Giving and the Round Up program. For many facing financial strain, these programs provide a pathway to stability, helping them maintain essential services and navigate challenging times with support from their cooperative community.
