Round Up: Spare Change Is Helping Real Neighbors

Round Up is a voluntary program that rounds your monthly bill up to the next dollar. The difference, less than a dollar, goes into the Cooperative Giving fund to help members who are struggling to pay their electric bills.

Small amounts, but they add up fast when hundreds of people are chipping in every month.



TCEC partners with Texas Neighborhood Services, a nonprofit serving families across North Texas to get that money to members who need it. In January alone, **22 people** received direct bill assistance through the program. Last month, **TCEC presented \$25,000** to Texas Neighborhood Services to keep those assistance payments going.





Even More Energy Savings: Rebate Program Expands for 2026!

In January 2026, TCEC launched the expanded [Energy Efficiency Rebates](#) program.

It's a straightforward way for members to earn money back for making qualifying home upgrades — increasing efficiency, getting paid back for the investment (tune-up, appliance, heat pump), and reducing future energy bills.



Limited funds available. First come, first served.

Here's how it works. Purchase a qualifying item, such as ENERGY STAR appliances or a Heat Pump tune-up. Then submit your receipt and a short application at tcectexas.com/energy-efficiency-rebates. TCEC reviews the submission and applies a credit directly to your account. Rebates range from up to \$50 for Energy Star products to up to \$125 for heat pump tune-ups and can be applied for twice during 2026. The program launched with \$350,000 in available funds, and is paid for by unclaimed funds, not members.

Efficiency upgrades may help reduce the monthly bill for as long as the equipment is running. The rebate just lowers the cost of getting started. Full details, the list of qualifying items, and the application are at tcectexas.com/energy-efficiency-rebates.

This is a first-come, first-served program and the funds won't last indefinitely.

Special Election Update – Districts 6 & 8

Applications for the Districts 6 and 8 Special Election were due January 23 at 5:00 p.m. to the [Credentials and Elections Committee](#).

For District 6, no applications were received. For District 8, one application was received from Mr. Frank Roszell.

The [Credentials and Elections Committee](#) found Mr. Roszell qualified to serve in accordance with the Cooperative's Bylaws and nominated him for the 2026 special election. As an unchallenged candidate, and consistent with Section 2.4 of the Bylaws, Mr. Roszell will be elected by acclamation at the Virtual Member Meeting on April 6, provided he continues to meet all eligibility requirements.
