



Cooperative Giving Update

At Tri-County Electric Cooperative (TCEC), our commitment to the <u>Seven</u> <u>Cooperative Principles</u> sets us apart—particularly Concern for Community. We remain dedicated to engaging meaningfully with the members we serve, while ensuring these efforts are carried out without subsidization from the membership.

In August 2024, we launched Cooperative Giving, a program designed to support members facing financial hardship. This initiative allows members, employees, and community members to make voluntary contributions to assist local neighbors with their electric bill payments.

Donations to <u>Cooperative Giving</u> can be made in several ways:

- One-time contributions
- Recurring on-bill donations
- Participation in Round Up for Cooperative Giving, where members choose to round up their electric bill to the nearest dollar—for example, a \$100.50 bill becomes \$101.00, with the extra 50 cents donated to the fund

Importantly, Cooperative Giving is legally and financially separate from TCEC, ensuring that no funds from members' electric bills are used unless a member requests to donate. All funds are voluntary and come from generous individuals —employees, members, and businesses—who want to make a difference.

<u>Texas Neighborhood Services</u>, a trusted local agency, will administer the program by ensuring all funding goes directly to paying the power bills of qualifying members in need. We anticipate that applications through Texas Neighborhood Services will open this June.

As of April 30, 2025, the Cooperative Giving program has raised a total of \$23,919.53:

- Employee Contributions: \$16,256.80
- Member Donations: \$1,160.00
- Round Up Contributions: \$121.72
- TCEC Board Members: \$300.00
- Fundraising Events: \$6,081.01

Currently, about 140 members are participating in the Round Up for Cooperative Giving or recurring donation programs, with many TCEC employees also donating a portion of their paychecks.

A 501(c)(3) application process has been completed to enhance the program's sustainability and impact. Once approved, this federal tax-exempt designation will make donations tax-deductible and allow even more of every dollar raised to go directly to helping members—rather than toward federal taxes.

Tri-County Electric Cooperative extends our sincere thanks to the volunteers in the <u>Parker County Retired School Personnel</u> for their time spent supporting the TCEC Scholarship Program.

These dedicated educators served as an impartial, third-party committee carefully reviewing applications and selecting a group of scholarship recipients from across the cooperative's service area. All selected students live with parents or legal guardians who are not part of TCEC's executive leadership.

This year, the program was expanded, awarding 50 scholarships valued at \$5,000 each—funded entirely through unclaimed capital credit funds. Scholarship recipients will be notified this week.

Schedule your tune-up today and stay cool while saving money!






Brazos Hardship Fund

If you or someone you know is struggling to pay their electric bill, this program could help.

The **Brazos Electric Ratepayer Hardship Fund**, funded by Brazos Electric Cooperative, assists low-income residential cooperative members with monthly bill credits to help offset additional charges from Winter Storm Uri (Brazos Rider). Monthly credit amounts vary based on energy usage.

NOT GETTING OUTAGE ALERTS?


Register Today! Receive a text notification within minutes of a power outage. This notification means your meter has already reported the outage—no action is needed from you.


Interactive Outage Map
