2020 District Meetings and Elections

The cooperative's 16-county service area is divided into eight director districts. Each year, one-third of the directors are up for election and meetings are held within the respective districts for director nominations. This year, director districts 1 and 4 are up for election. Directors are elected to three-year terms.

District Meetings notices were mailed to all members residing in District 1 and District 4 on Saturday, June 6, 2020, in accordance with the cooperative's bylaws. The meeting for District 1 was held on Wednesday, July 8, at 404 Main Place in Azle. The meeting for District 4 was held on Thursday, July 9, at Garner Elementary School in Weatherford.

Voting Information

A Year in Review

A Message from your General Manager/CEO & Board Chairman

Electric cooperatives were born from the Great Depression. More than 80 years later, they continue to prosper through adversity. This year is a perfect example.

Last August, Tri-County Electric Cooperative launched the pilot for our Advanced Member Power project and began deploying our new advanced metering system. Our current metering system is approaching its end-of-life in 2021 and the software will no longer be supported. As of late July, about 60 percent of our old meters have been upgraded to digital smart meters – a more efficient and responsive system that allows you, as members, to easily monitor electricity use and track your savings.



BOARD CHAIRMAN JORDEN WOOD

Tri-County Electric Co-op continues to expand maintenance efforts – pole and underground inspections and vegetation management – to increase system reliability. Most of our system in the Keller area is underground. This reduces visual clutter, but it provides challenges when troubleshooting outages and increases restoration time. We are ramping up inspections to identify issues before they cause your power to go out. Vegetation management efforts have ramped up as well. Properly maintained rights-of-way keep trees from encroaching on our lines, which reduces blinks and outages.

In early 2020, a global pandemic brought a new challenge for our lives and businesses. In early March, cooperative leadership made the decision to close our lobbies to protect our members, the public and our employees. Drive-through windows in Azle and Keller remain open for regular business hours to

serve our members while ensuring health and safety. The power industry does not lend itself to a work-from-home environment like many businesses, so every employee continues to come to work each day. To stay safe and healthy, we continue to practice social distancing and use virtual communication platforms.

In April we held a special election asking members' opinion on the sale of our subsidiary company. A letter and a ballot were mailed to more than 91,000 members, a direct representation of Cooperative Principle No. 2: Democratic Member Control. More than 29,500 members participated in the election, with more than 90 percent in favor of the sale. The board is in the process of completing the sale, which will allow us to get back to our core task: serving our members with affordable, reliable electricity.

As if we did not have enough going on, we moved into our new Aledo office in May. Personnel from various departments, including accounting, engineering, administrative, system operations and others, now work under one roof in the new facility. Crew members remain in Azle, along with a few member services employees who keep the drive-through open.

In July we held district meetings for director districts 1 and 4. A full report on these meetings is on page 24. On the ballot located on the back of this magazine, you will see Mr. Jerry Walden as the nominee for Director District 4. Since the resignation of our District 1 Director in late May, the Board considered and weighed their options in accordance with cooperative bylaws. There was an opportunity for the members of District 1 to nominate a candidate for the Board at the District 1 Meeting. The meeting did not meet the 3 percent attendance required for a quorum, so the vacancy on the Board for District 1 will be filled by appointment by the Board of Directors. After careful consideration, the Board has decided to hold off on appointing a member to fill the vacancy while they examine the boundaries and membership size of the co-op's director districts.

For a few years, the Board has looked at revising our cooperative bylaws. Those changes are coming soon and will be announced to the membership in the next few months. The changes being considered reflect best practices and are in the interest of the cooperative and its members. Revising boundaries and bylaws is never easy, but the board vacancy has created an opportune moment. It has been several years since the director district boundaries have been reviewed and edited.

Looking back, the past year was full of milestones, achievements and challenges for your cooperative. We look forward to another successful year taking care of our member-owners.

Report on 2020 District Meetings

The cooperative's 16-county service area is divided into eight director districts. Each year, one-third of the directors are up for election. District meetings are held within the respective districts for the purpose of nominating a fellow member-owner to be placed on the ballot at Annual Meeting. Directors are elected to three-year terms and represent the member-owners of their district in the board room.

This year, director districts 1 and 4 are up for election.

District 1 Meeting

District Meetings notices were mailed to 9,529 member-owners residing in District 1 on Saturday, June 6, 2020, in accordance with the cooperative's bylaws. The quorum requirement to conduct business was 285 member-owners.

The meeting for District 1 was held at 6:30 pm on Wednesday, July 8, at 404 Main Place in Azle. Registration opened at 6 pm and 84 member-owners registered at the meeting. Since quorum was not met, no official buisness was held.

District 4 Meeting

District Meetings notices were mailed to 6,445 member-owners residing in District 4 on Saturday, June 6, 2020, in accordance with the cooperative's bylaws. The quorum requirement to conduct business was 192 member-owners.

The meeting for District 4 was held at 6:30 pm on Thursday, July 9, at Garner Elementary School in Weatherford. Registration opened at 6 pm and 94 member-owners registered at the meeting. Since quorum was not met, no official buisness was held and Mr. Jerry Walden of Garner became the official nominee for Director District 4.

District 1

The District 1 Director seat on the Board of Directors is vacant.

Mr. Todd Smith resigned his seat on the Board of Directors after being named the lone finalist for the Azle ISD Superintendent position.

The Board of Directors is weighing options to fill the vacant postion in accordance to cooperative bylaws.

80th Annual Meeting Minutes

The 80th Annual Meeting of the members of Tri-County Electric Cooperative, Inc. was held at the Weatherford High School Auditorium, 2121 Bethel Road, Weatherford, Texas, on Tuesday, October 1, 2019 at 7:00 p.m.

Special guests, Tri-County Electric Cooperative Board of Directors and General Counsel were then introduced.

Darryl Schriver, General Manager/ CEO began with a few prize drawings.

Ms. Barron then introduced the President of the Tri-County Electric Cooperative Board of Directors, Jorden Wood. The meeting was then called to order by Mr. Wood.

Ms. Barron then read the notice of the annual meeting and proof of mailing. It was reported that a total of 89,702 notices of the Annual Meeting had been mailed. The quorum requirements for the election of Directors must be set at a minimum of 4,485. There were 3,804 ballots returned by mail, and 1,170 ballots in person at this meeting for a total of 4,974 ballots cast for this election resulting in a quorum.

Mr. Schriver called for the approval of the minutes of the 2018 Annual Meeting. A motion and a second was made from the floor to dispense with the reading of the minutes. The motion carried and the minutes were approved.

Todd Smith, Secretary/Treasurer then gave the Treasurer's report to the membership.

Mr. Schriver then reported on the District Meetings in Districts 5, 9, and 10. The

nomination process was explained. At each of the District Meetings a Director was nominated. Steve Harris was the nominee for District 5, Max Waddell District 9, and Larry Miller for District 10. The nominees are elected by mail ballots and ballots presented today. Based on the vote tabulation from the ballots, the nominees were approved by the membership in accordance with the Cooperative Bylaws and were elected for a threevear term to the Tri-County Electric Cooperative Board of Directors

Prize drawings continued.

Mr. Schriver then recognized the employees and gave a report on the state of the Cooperative.

The business meeting was then adjourned at 8:00 p.m.

Prize drawings continued, and Mr. Schriver thanked the vendors who contributed prizes for the Annual Meeting.
